## BEFORE THE ARIZONA STATE BOARD OF 1 RESPIRATORY CARE EXAMINERS 2 In the Matter of: CASE NO. 2019-RCE-0106 3 SETH MCGOWAN, RCP CONSENT AGREEMENT AND Holder of License No. 009322 NON-DISCIPLINARY ORDER 4 5 For the Practice of Respiratory Care In the State of Arizona 6 7 **CONSENT AGREEMENT** 8 RECITALS 9 In the interest of a prompt and judicious settlement of the above-captioned matter before 10 the Arizona State Board of Respiratory Care Examiners ("Board"), and in the interest of 11 protecting the people of the State of Arizona, consistent with the statutory requirements and 12 responsibilities of the Board pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-3501, et seq. and A.R.S. § \[ \frac{41}{1092.07} \] 13 (F)(5), Seth McGowan, RCP ("Respondent"), holder of license number 009322 to practice 14 respiratory care in the State of Arizona, and the Board enter into the following Consent 15 Agreement for Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Non-Disciplinary Order for 16 Continuing Education and Civil Penalty ("Consent Agreement") as the final disposition of this 17 matter. 18 Respondent has the right to consult with an attorney prior to entering into this 1. 19 Consent Agreement. Respondent has read and understands this Consent Agreement as set forth 20 herein, and has had the opportunity to discuss this Consent Agreement with an attorney or has 21 waived the opportunity. Respondent voluntarily enters into this Consent Agreement for the 22 purpose of avoiding the expense and uncertainty of an administrative hearing. 23 2. Respondent understands that he/she has a right to a public administrative hearing 24 concerning each and every allegation set forth in the above-captioned matter, at which time 25 Respondent could present evidence and cross-examine witnesses. By entering into this Consent 26 Agreement, Respondent freely and voluntarily relinquishes all rights to such an administrative

hearing, as well as all rights of rehearing, review, reconsideration, appeal, judicial review, or any other administrative, and/or judicial action concerning the matters set forth herein. Respondent affirmatively agrees that this Consent Agreement shall be irrevocable and any modifications to this original document are ineffective and void unless mutually approved by the parties in writing.

- 3. Respondent agrees that the Board may adopt this Consent Agreement or any part of this agreement under A.R.S. §§ 32-3552 and 32-3553. Respondent understands that the Board may consider this Consent Agreement or any part of it in any future disciplinary action against him.
- 4. Respondent understands that this Consent Agreement does not constitute a dismissal or resolution of other matters currently pending before the Board, *if any*, and does not constitute any waiver, express or implied, of the Board's statutory authority or jurisdiction regarding any other pending or future investigation, action, or proceeding.
- 5. All admissions Respondent makes in this Consent Agreement are made solely for the final disposition of case numbers 2019-RCE-0106, and any related administrative proceedings or civil litigation involving the Board and Respondent. Respondent further understands that acceptance of the Consent Agreement does not preclude any other agency, subdivision, or officer of this state from instituting other civil or criminal proceedings with respect to the conduct that is the subject of this Consent Agreement.
- 6. Respondent acknowledges that it is the Board's position that if this matter proceeded to formal hearing, the Board could likely establish sufficient evidence to support a conclusion that certain of Respondent's conduct constituted unprofessional conduct under A.R.S. § 32-3552 and A.A.C. R4-45-214. Therefore, Respondent has agreed to enter into this Consent Agreement as an economical and practical means of resolving the issues associated with the Board's investigation.
  - 7. The Consent Agreement shall be subject to approval by the Board and shall be

1	effective only when signed by the Executive Director and accepted by the Board. In the event	
2	that the Board does not approve this Consent Agreement, it is withdrawn and shall be of no	
3	evidentiary value and shall not be relied upon nor introduced in any action by any party. The	
4	parties agree that if the Board rejects this Consent Agreement and this case proceeds to hearing,	
5	Respondent shall assert no claim that the Board was prejudiced by its review and discussion of	
6	this document or any other records relating thereto.	
. 7	8. Respondent understands that this Consent Agreement is a public record that may	
_ 8	be publicly disseminated as a formal action of the Board.	
9	9. Respondent understands that any violation of this Consent Agreement could be	
10	grounds for further disciplinary action by the Board pursuant to A.A.C. R4-45-214(3).

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15	FINDINGS OF FACT	
16	2. The Arizona State Board of Respiratory Care Examiners is the duly constituted	
17	agency for licensing and regulating of the practice of respiratory care in the State of Arizona and	
18	has jurisdiction over Respondent as a licensee of the Board and the subject matter pursuant to	
19	A.R.S. § 32-3501; et-seq.	<b>-</b>
20	2. Seth McGowan, RCP, is the holder of License Number 009322, which enables	
21	him/her to practice respiratory care in the State of Arizona.	
22	3. Respondent was selected for a Continuing Education Audit pursuant to A.A.C.	
23	R4-45-208. Respondent did not comply with the Board's request for the random Continuing	
24	Education Audit on or before the date specified in the audit notice and submitted zero hours of	
25	approved Continuing Education Units to the Board. Respondent was unable to produce	
26	documentation showing they had obtained twenty hours of approved continuing education as	
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required by law and has failed to demonstrate compliance with the continuing education requirement mandated for Respondent's last renewal period.

## **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- 1. The conduct described in the Findings of Fact constitute grounds for disciplinary action pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 32-3552(A)(1) and (3) and violate the provisions of A.R.S. § 32-3501(9)(i) which states, "Any conduct or practice which is contrary to recognized standards of ethics of the respiratory therapy profession or any conduct or practice which does or might constitute a danger to the health, welfare or safety of the patient or the public."
- 2. The conduct described in the Findings of Fact constitute grounds for disciplinary action pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 32-3552(A)(1) and (3) and violate the provisions of A.R.S. § 32-3501(9)(k), which states, "Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of or conspiring to violate a provision of this chapter."
- 3. The conduct described in the Findings of Fact constitute grounds for disciplinary action pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 32-3552(A)(1) and (3) and violate the provisions of A.A.C R4-45-214 (2) which states, "Procuring or attempting to procure by fraud or misrepresentation a license or renewal of a license to practice respiratory care."

## **ORDER**

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT Seth McGowan, RCP, holder of License No. 009322 shall-be subject to the following:

1. Respondent shall pay a non-disciplinary CIVIL PENALTY of \$25.00 per missing continuing education hour in the total amount of FIVE HUNDRED AND 00/100 DOLLARS (\$500.00) for failing to complete 20 continuing education hours within the required renewal period. This Civil Penalty shall be paid to the Arizona State Board of Respiratory Care Examiners by no later than NINETY (90) DAYS from the effective date of this Order.
